




Cape May County Veteran Resources

Cape May County Veterans can find help and information right here in the county. The Cape May County Veterans' Bureau was established shortly after World War II to aid and assist Veterans, widows and their families. It provides service to countywide Veterans to eliminate the need to travel long distances to obtain Veterans' benefits, program information and assistance. Veterans can find out about: Compensation, non-service connected pension, educational benefits, government life insurance, VA Healthcare,

correction/review of military records, lost discharges/DD for 214/Request for military service medals, burial allowances and grave markers. Also, veterans can find out about Fare Free Transportation for veterans in Cape May County plus the county's veteran photo ID Cards, available through the County Clerk's Office, that enable veterans to receive various discounts offered to them by businesses in Cape May County. **A Place of honor...** The Cape May County Veterans Cemetery was created by the Board of

Chosen Freeholders in 1980 to provide a final resting place for County resident wartime Veter-



ans and their spouses. The cemetery is located at 129 Crest Haven Road, Cape May Court House, off the Garden State Parkway at milepost 11. Veteran's interested in interment at the Cemetery are encouraged to register at the Cape May County Veterans' Bureau, located at 4005 Route 9 South, Rio Grande, NJ 08242. **Memorial Garden...** The Cape

May County Veterans Cemetery now has a Memorial Garden thanks to the efforts of Eagle Scout Zac Lambert and Boy Scout Troop 73 of West Cape May. The garden, Lambert's Eagle Scout Project, includes benches amid shrubs and greenery that allow visitors a place to reflect on their loved ones. The Boy Scouts worked on the project for

several months and received donations from the community to make the project a reality. The first place winner with a score of 921 is Diane Hufana of Low Township, the second place winner with a score of 842 points is Mae Pacifico-Anderson of Del Haven, Brian Fitzpatrick of the Villas finished third with a score of 820 and fourth place went to Russ Wuest of Dennisville with 809 points.

The Department's annual spring training day dubbed "The Roadeo" tests drivers in their everyday activities. The total points that can be earned during the competition is 1,000 points. Each driver is tested in Vehicle Pre-trip and can earn a possible 150 points, Wheelchair Securement is worth 200 points and an Obstacle Course that tests their driving skills is worth 525 points. Also, participants take a written exam worth 125 points that evaluates their knowledge of Federal ADA regulations, rules of the road and passenger service standards.

Cape May County Sheriff's Office K-9 Unit

The Cape May County Sheriff's Office K-9 Unit assists in solving crimes and helping residents in Cape May County and throughout the region.

The K-9 unit, established in 1985, is responsible for providing the service of search and rescue, and apprehension of missing or wanted persons. The K-9 unit operates on a 24 hour basis to assist local, State and Federal police agencies. This unit has proved to be a valuable asset to local agencies within the county because of rapid response time and availability on last minute notice.

There are many varied usages and capabilities of the

dogs in this unit, including lost person search, woodland Criminal detection pursuit, tracking, trailing, evidence recovery, explosion detection, narcotics detection, patrol dogs, evidence recovery, and accelerant detection. The unit also offers leadership and training expertise in search and rescue operations and criminal pursuit incidents and is an important part of the Project Lifesaver Program.

The K-9 unit currently consists of five officers/handlers and eight dogs. German Shepherds for law enforcement related activities and bloodhounds for lost or missing persons searches



and woodland criminal pursuits.

The unit has conducted over seven hundred searches for narcotics, over three hundred arson investigations, searched for over hundred missing persons and has responded to over



two hundred calls for explosive device detection. They have also seized over one hundred thousand dollars in drug money and another one hundred thousand in confiscated narcotics.

The Cape May County K-9 Unit also offers training for K-9 officers from Sheriff's


Office Agencies and other Police Agencies within New Jersey which is conducted at the Cape May County Sheriff's Office K-9 Training facility, located at the Crest Haven Complex.

Additionally, many organizations in the county make donations to support

the unit and officers within the K-9 Unit give back to the community by providing demonstrations at local schools, Dare Programs, 4-H fairs and other community activities.



Cape May County Public Works Department Keeps People on the Move

The department's responsibilities include twenty-seven bridges, 212 miles of roadway, 150 traffic signals, over one thousand drainage systems, as well as, responsibility for some buildings and much more.

The Department consists of a number of divisions. The County Engineer's Office provides design services, engineering, construction management and inspection of county road and bridge projects. Currently, the Office is working on approximately 100 various transportation related projects that are at different stages of completion including the Ocean Drive (CR619) Bridge over Townsends Inlet Rehabilitation project that is in phase two. The first phase, completed during the 2013-14 winter season. The second phase consists of re-



placing machinery components to the movable span; various repairs to the movable span girders, the tollhouse span structural steel members and a girder in an approach span on the Avalon side of the bridge. Additionally, the steel bridge railing and the electrical wiring in the tollhouse and movable spans is being replaced. Once completed, the bridge will be able to return to the former load posting of fifteen tons and will be able to carry NJ Transit buses. The \$4.5 million project is expected to be completed May.

The **Road and Bridge Maintenance Divisions**, clean, inspect, pave and repair all county roads and provide plowing and snow removal services, as well as, placing salt and de-icing materials



Cape May County and Coast Guard Work Together

For many reasons, the Coast Guard and Cape May County share a special bond that has been forged over the last 100 years. The local community has always acknowledged the professional work of the Coast Guard men and women assigned to their area. This recognition helps make Coast Guard men and women, and their families, feel at home in their home away from home and is an invaluable

contribution to morale and service excellence. In return, the Coast Guard has implemented ways to give back to Cape May County and one way in particular provides an enhanced level of partnership and preparedness that keeps our "home away from home" safe and secure.

Members of the Coast Guard Fire Department, stationed on-board the Coast Guard Training Center Cape May, and members of local fire departments have memorandums of agreement

that allows for inter-agency support and opportunities to regularly conduct fire suppression training that help save lives and keep our communities safe.

"We respond to their emergencies, and they respond to ours," said CGFD Asst. Fire Chief, Ryan Geraghty. "Just another example of the Coast Guard taking care of its hometown."

Resources from the CMFD are made available to support the municipalities that have emergencies and in turn, the surrounding towns offer their support in the event the training center experiences an emergency. Additionally, the local assets and the CGFD often train together to familiarize themselves with how they would respond.

"This training is important," Geraghty said. "Teamwork and coordination, ahead of time, could mean the difference between life and death."

The CGFD has 18 firemen, who consist of both active duty Coast Guard and civilian fire fighters. In 2014, the CGFD responded to approximately 100 emergency responses in the surrounding community.

With constant teamwork, understanding and support, the Coast Guard in Cape May County

is not just "the" Coast Guard, but "your" Coast Guard. A fact that will be celebrated during the Coast Guard Community Festival May 8 - 10 as Cape May County is recognized as a Coast Guard Community; one of only 17 in the nation.

The commanding officer of Coast Guard Training Center Cape May sums it up best when he says, "This designation goes to show that Cape May County is the best place to live, work and visit in the Coast Guard."

CAPE MAY COAST UNIT CHANGES COMMAND, OUTGOING LEADER PREPARES FOR YEARLONG OVERSEAS DEPLOYMENT

The crew of the 87-foot Coast Guard Cutter Mako held a change-of-command ceremony Friday, April 17 at Coast Guard Training Center Cape May.

During the ceremony, Master Chief Petty Officer William D. Hollandsworth relinquished command of the coastal patrol boat and crew to Master Chief Petty Officer Eric T. Lepley.

Lepley is reporting from Pensacola, Fla., where he served as the officer in charge aboard the 87-foot Coast Guard Cutter Bonito.

Hollandsworth is preparing to deploy for a yearlong deployment to Bahrain, where he will serve as the command master chief at U.S. Coast Guard Patrol Forces Southwest Asia.

As the command master chief, Hollandsworth will be the senior enlisted advisor to more than 300 Coast Guard personnel assigned to locations in Bahrain, Kuwait and Afghanistan, as well as six 110-foot Coast Guard cutter crews.

Hollandsworth's family will continue to live in Cape May

for the duration of his deployment.

The primary missions of the Mako's crew include search and rescue, enforcement of laws and treaties, marine environmental protection, and maritime safety and security.

The change-of-command ceremony is a formal naval tradition, which includes the transfer of total responsibility and authority from one individual to another.

Cape May County is one of only two counties in the nation that have been awarded the designation "Coast Guard Community." (Fifteen cities in the nation have earned the designation of "Coast Guard City.") This designation was sought by the community through a rigorous application process, and was awarded after approval from the United States Coast Guard and United States Congress.

Training Center Cape May (TRACEN), the U.S. Coast Guard's fifth largest base, is the only venue in the county where Coast Guard recruits receive their basic training. It also includes commands that engage in missions such as vessel support, participation in air/sea rescue, investigative services, communications and homeland security services.




Nestled between the Cape May Canal and the Historical City of Cape May is the historically significant "Schellenger's Landing." Originally a shipbuilding center for not only commercial fishing boats, but for tugs commissioned by the U.S. Government, locals and visitors alike today can still enjoy all kinds of activities in this unique area just before entering Cape May proper.

Ernest Utsch, Sr. was a successful candy maker from the "Brewerytown" section of Philadelphia and with the help of his son, Ernest Utsch, Jr. and their respective families; they operated the store on 29th Street near Girard Avenue for years. But Ernest and his son loved visiting the Cape May area to pick strawberries and "fish for their dinner."

The two "Ernies" ended up purchasing a party boat, the GERTRUDE W and then another, the TERN. "It is time" ...Ernie, Jr. told his dad...it was time; to "build a marina for our boats and," so, in 1951, UTSCHE'S MARINA was founded.

Hard work ensued; 80 slips were built. A house, which had been built during WWII provided a safe place for the entire family relocating from Philadelphia to Cape May. The candy store was sold and all efforts went into the establishment of the marina. In the mid-1950s the State of New Jersey decided that the old flat bridge would no longer serve the traffic traveling to Cape May, so to accommodate the building of the current "Cape May County Veteran's Bridge," the marina was moved and cut down in size. The house had to be moved too, but the Utsch family persevered through these rough times.

"The day began at 4 am in order to have bait, ice and fuel ready for the boats going out for the day. An onsite restaurant, run by the "infamous Uncle Charlie" was open for breakfast; lunches were packed for those going out on the water for the day. The entire family, including young Ernie III, Charles and RoseMarie II were constantly "on deck" for whatever was necessary to keep the boats running and customers happy.

We could jump off the docks and swim in the marina...grab a little aluminum boat and with the family dog, take a cruise around the harbor and down the canal...life was SO good!

We now have a 300 plus slip marina, with a Bait & Tackle Shop, a Ship's Store to accommodate any part needed to keep your boat in "Ship Shape!" If you visit us by way of the Ocean or Delaware Bay via boat, we have the "Southern Hospitality" charm on constant display. We want you to consider UTSCHE'S MARINA as "YOUR HOME AWAY FROM HOME" ... we want OUR children to experience and enjoy the same lifestyle we grew up with...happy and carefree!


Throughout the years, we lost Ernie Sr. and Gertrude, and in 1994 we lost our beloved mother, RoseMarie; so it was up to Dad, Ernie III and Charles to keep the family tradition going, which they continued to do.

Unfortunately, in October 2013, at the age of 90, while still an active member of the marina we lost our "beloved founder," Ernest Utsch, Jr. Our hearts are still raw and grieving, but we are grateful for our "family" of boaters and fishermen, who surround us with love and compassion. UTSCHE'S MARINA will continue on, as we have for the past 63 years, with Ernie III and Charles now at the helm.

If you are new to boating and fishing, visit our marina; we have lots of activities to keep the entire family happy. We have on our premises The Cape May Whale Watch and Research Center where you can learn about the local dolphins and whales in the area. We also have East Coast Parasailing where you can see Cape May from another perspective...up high in the sky! Jet Skis and a super cool Jet boat will take you around...and we mean "360 degrees" around! Hell Yeah Water Sports will let you tube in the local waters. Oh! And don't forget...in August the Bayshore Discovery Project brings the tall ship "MEERWALD" to the marina for kids' summer camps and daily and evening cruises aboard a truly restored and historic vessel. For you serious fishermen, we have a dozen or more charter boats residing at the marina to help you catch "the BIG ONE!"







The Cape May County Department of Fare Free Transportation has been helping county residents get around for some forty-two years and the focus has always been on the rider.

As a community paratransit system, Fare Free Transportation provides door to door service for one time appointments or on a regular basis, plus a bus route service to senior citizens, persons with disabilities, veterans, individuals of low-income and the general public on a first come-first served basis.

Leading the Way! Cape May County was the first to develop a fully coordinated and comprehensive Fare Free Transportation system in the country in 1973 and still remains one of the most successful transportation systems of its kind in New Jersey. Transportation is provided for almost any purpose including dialysis; physical, speech, and occupational therapy; medical appointments; employment; nutritional sites; nursing homes, personal errands such as banking, trips to the hairdresser or to go shopping.

A Million Miles a year! Fare Free plays an integral part in moving residents around. Fare Free drivers ride more than one million miles each year making sure county residents in need can go to the doctor, receive lifesaving medical treatment and do every day errands. To accomplish this task, there are forty active Fare Free vehicles that make between 500 and 700 trips per day and approximately **140,000 trips each year**, not including regular shopping routes.

Anyone who has trouble hearing or understanding speech or words clearly is welcomed to have a test using the most modern electronic equipment to determine if their hearing loss is one which may be helped.

Everyone should have a hearing test at least once a year if there is any trouble at all hearing clearly. Even people not wearing a hearing aid or those who have been told nothing could be done for them, should have a hearing test and find out whether the modern methods of hearing correction can help them hear better. The Free Hearing Tests will be given by factory trained Hearing Aid Specialists licensed by the State of New Jersey Mondays through Fridays May 1st through May 30th.
